City offices will be closed at 12:00 Noon on Tuesday, December 24th; all day on Wednesday, December 25th; 12:00 Noon on Tuesday, December 31st; and all day on Wednesday, January 1st, in observance of the Christmas and New Year's holidays. The entire City staff extends best wishes to you and your family for a happy holiday season. City offices will also be closed on Monday, January 20th in observance of Martin Luther King, Jr. Day.

TRASH AND RECYCLING HOLIDAY SCHEDULE

In observance of Christmas Day and New Year's Day, Wednesday, December 25th and Wednesday, January 1st, all service days will be changed from their scheduled day to the following day. If your service is normally scheduled for Wednesday it will be picked up on Thursday of that week, Thursday's pickup will be on Friday, and Friday's pickup will be on Saturday. The service days for Monday and Tuesday will be unaffected. Trash collection during the week of January 20th will remain unchanged, due to the fact that the trash hauler does not observe Martin Luther King, Jr. Day.

CANDIDATE FILING - APRIL 2020 ELECTION

Filing for the position of Alderpersons in Wards 1, 2 and 3 for the April 7, 2020 election will open at 8:00 a.m. on Tuesday, December 17, 2019 and close at 5:00 p.m. on Tuesday, January 21, 2020. The minimum age is 18 for an Alderperson position. Candidates may file for office at City Hall during normal business hours, 8:00 a.m. - 5:00 p.m., Monday through Friday. EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITIES

The City of Eureka is accepting applications for the full-time and part-time positions listed below. There is no application deadline, and interviews will be conducted periodically until the positions are filled. Building Inspector

Full-time position. Duties include enforcement of building codes and zoning regulations, performing inspections, processing permit applications and minor plan review. Salary is \$38,500.00, plus excellent benefits.

Finance Assistant

Part-time position for 25 hours per week (Monday through Friday, 5 hours per day). Compensation is \$16.00 per hour.

Police Clerk/Jailer

Part-time position. Hours are Fridays from 1:00 A.M. to 8:00 A.M., Saturdays from 1:00 A.M. to 8:00 A.M. and Sundays from 12:00 Midnight to 8:00 A.M. Compensation is \$14.02 per hour.

THEFT PROTECTION MEASURES

Garages may be entered via garage door openers left in unlocked vehicles and through unlocked doors allowing items to be stolen while you are sleeping. BOARD OF ALDERMEN ACTION

Adopted the following by Ordinance:

- Amending Commercial Zoning District Special Uses
- Rezoning 23.62 acres from R-1 and R-5 to R-5C Multiple Family Residential at 300 Forby Road
- Authorizing entering into an agreement for the provision of Banking Depository Services
- Authorizing entering into a Subscriber Radio System Agreement with St. Louis County
- Authorizing entering into an Agreement with the Rockwood School District for Creek Debris Removal Services

EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS

There are a number of severe weather hazards that affect Missouri, including thunderstorms, tornadoes, lightning, floods and flash floods, damaging winds and large hail, snow and ice. Severe weather hazards have the potential to cause extensive property damage, injury and/or death. The National Weather Service and the American Red Cross have developed Emergency Preparedness Guides, which contain information about winter weather terms and tips for staying safe at home, in the car and at work or school. Emergency preparedness is no longer the sole concern of earthquake prone Californians and those who live in the part of the country known as "Tornado Alley". Knowing what to do during an emergency is an important part of being prepared and may make all the difference when seconds count. Go to www.ready.gov for preparedness tips.

HOME SAFETY TIPS

The high cost of home heating fuels and utilities has caused many people to search for alternate sources of heating. The following is a list of things to help prevent potential fire hazards:

- Never use your oven to heat your home.
- Never allow children to play near any heating source such as a fireplace or space heater.
- Have your chimney inspected and cleaned annually by a certified chimney professional and use a metal mesh screen when in use.
- Have a fire extinguisher available.
- Store fuels in proper containers keeping them out of the reach of children and away from combustibles.
- Teach young children that hot things can burn them.

In at least 23% of all fatal residential fires no smoke alarms were present. Keep your family safe by installing a smoke and carbon monoxide alarm on every level of your home and inside bedrooms. If your bedrooms are on an upper level, you may want to purchase an emergency escape ladder. In addition, have an escape plan ready and practice it on a regular basis.

LIVE CHRISTMAS TREE DISPOSAL

All decorations (including tinsel) should be removed for Christmas tree disposal after the holidays. Do not place trees in plastic bags. It is not necessary to cut and bundle Christmas trees for pickup.

ADDRESS NUMBERS

Just a reminder, as required by City Code, all residential property located within the City limits shall have address numbers, a minimum height of 4", affixed to your residence or placed on the property so as to be clearly visible by emergency and City vehicles from the street in front of the residence.

PEDESTRIAN SAFETY RULES

Just a reminder when walking or riding bicycles along thoroughfares - the rule of thumb when walking is to always walk facing the oncoming traffic. However, when riding a bicycle, you should be traveling in the same direction as the traffic flow. In both instances, wear light colored clothing and reflective material during the evening hours.
