



Pool Rules

- 1) All facility users must obey the lifeguards.
- 2) Adults are expected to directly supervise children in their care.
- 3) Children ages 11 and under must be accompanied by an adult.
- 4) Diving is permitted from the diving board only.
- 5) Breath-holding and/or prolonged underwater swimming is strictly prohibited.
- 6) Facility users are expected to walk on the pool deck. Running is strictly prohibited.
- 7) Any person with a skin rash is not allowed to enter the facility.
- 8) Pushing, dunking and other types of horseplay is strictly prohibited.
- 9) No fighting of any kind is allowed. Individuals involved in an altercation will be dismissed from the facility for the remainder of the summer.
- 10) Hanging or sitting on any lane line or rope is strictly prohibited.
- 11) Outside food and beverages are not permitted, with the exception of water in clear plastic containers. Food and beverages purchased from the concession stand must remain in the concession area. Chewing gum is not permitted in the facility.
- 12) Only Coast Guard approved flotation devices will be allowed. Inflatable flotation devices, rafts, mermaid tales and hard throwing balls are prohibited.
- 13) Staff reserves the right to remove any item from the pool for the safety of other guests.
- 14) Do not climb on the ledge of the infinity wall. Do not enter the lazy river from the side.
- 15) Patrons are encouraged to bathe with soap and water before entering the pool and all swimmers must wear a swimsuit into the water.
- 16) T-shirts may be worn in the pool. They must be clean, not cutoff or torn, and any language or symbols must be able to withstand public scrutiny. Persons wearing t-shirts must stay in the shallow end of the pool. Shoes (with the exception of water shoes) are not allowed in the pool.
- 17) Swim diapers must be worn at all times for children who are not potty trained.
- 18) At any time, a lifeguard or aquatic staff member may add or enforce additional rules not set forth herein in the event activities perceived to be harmful or potentially harmful to any person or property require the creation of such rules.
- 19) The City of Eureka reserves the right to modify these rules at any time to ensure the safety of our guests and staff.

Inclement Weather Policy

Timbers supervisory staff may delay opening of the pool or close early due to dangerous weather conditions, low attendance, rain, or air temperatures below 70 degrees. The pool will close for 30 minutes each time thunder and/or lightning occurs.

Rain checks will be issued if operations are suspended for 60 minutes or more. Guests can exchange their receipt for a rain check should they choose to leave the facility. Rain checks will be valid for two weeks after the initial visit. If a raincheck is issued and the pool reopens, guests will be required to return the rain check to gain admission back into the facility that day. No rain checks will be issued during the final two hours of operations. Guests can also request a wristband to come back in the same day. Refunds will not be issued.

Slide Rules

- 1) Maximum operational load: 1 person, 300 pounds
- 2) Children under 40 inches tall are not permitted on the slide.
- 3) Eyeglasses must be securely affixed to riders with head straps.
- 4) Swim wear with exposed zippers, buckles, rivets or metal ornamentations are not permitted.
- 5) Only one rider to enter the flume at a time. Single riders only.
- 6) Never form chains.
- 7) Slide must be ridden feet first lying on your back or in a sitting position.
- 8) Riders must wait for the attendant's start signal before entering the slide.
- 9) Keep arms and hands inside the flume at all times.
- 10) Do not run, dive, stand, kneel, rotate or stop on the slide.
- 11) At the end of the slide, obey all instructions by lifeguard and exit quickly.
- 12) For safety reasons, pregnant women and persons with heart conditions or back trouble should not ride slide.

Diving Board Rules

- 1) Use of the diving board is limited to swimmers able to swim one length of the pool without stopping or struggling.
- 2) Only one person is permitted on the board at a time.
- 3) Dives must be executed straight off the board; inward and reverse dives are not allowed.
- 4) Cartwheels, handstands and seat drops are considered dangerous and are not allowed.
- 5) Only one bounce is permitted on the board.
- 6) Swimming in the diving area is not allowed while the diving board is open.
- 7) A diver must immediately swim to the ladder or under the rope once they have entered the water.
- 8) The next diver may not dive until the first diver has touched the ladder or passed the rope.
- 9) Parents supervising their child's dive may sit on the side of the pool in the diving area.
- 10) No goggles.
- 11) No floatation device, unless strapped under their body.
- 12) No catching anyone in the water.
- 13) The lifeguard has the right to prohibit any dive that seems too dangerous for the diver to perform.
- 14) Staff has the right to close down the diving board at any time to allow for open swim in the deep end of the pool.
